

NATURE EDUCATION AND RESTORATION ASSISTANT

(Casual Temporary Summer Student Position)

NATURE OF WORK: The Parks and Recreation Department is seeking a student, with a biology/environmental studies background, to work on urban forest restoration projects, invasive species management, nature education, and park maintenance. These positions will report directly to the Forest and Environmental Officer.

Casual 17-week summer position – As part of a team, help deliver a nature education program, invasive species management, and urban forest restoration work, as well as native plant gardening in Victoria Park.

This job description reflects the general details considered necessary to describe the principal functions of the job identified and shall not be construed as a detailed description of all the work requirements that may be inherent in such classification.

ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS:

- Reports directly to the Forest and Environmental Officer.
- Works closely with all members of the Sustainability department.
- Develops and Maintains working relationships with members of Council, departmental managers, supervisors, and all City employees to provide support to Sustainability.
- Deals with the public with integrity and in a professional and courteous manner.

PRIMARY FUNCTIONS/ACCOUNTABILITIES:

- Adheres to health and safety policies in the workplace.
- Coordinates/assists in coordinating and delivering a nature education program related to urban habitats, wildlife, native plants, and invasive species.
- Assists in the implementation of urban reforestation projects.
- Conducts tree planting, pruning, and maintenance activities.
- Helps with the delivery of tree planting events.
- Conducts maintenance on native tree arboretum and perennial beds.
- Manages invasive plant species.
- Collects data on reforestation work, flora and fauna inventories and other environmental monitoring.

REQUIRED COMPETENICES:

- Ability to work independently with good self-motivation.
- Good team player.
- Ability to work overtime to accommodate events as required.
- Communicates effectively, verbally and in writing.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Enrolled in Environmental, Forestry, or Biology studies.
- Good identification skills trees, shrubs, herbaceous plants, ferns, wildlife.
- Must have the ability to work with children.
- Knowledge of Microsoft Office programs and internet applications is an asset.
- Ability to conduct physical work outdoors, in all types of weather.
- Must be able to work independently.
- Valid driver's license is an asset.
