City of Charlottetown, PEI A Bylaw to Amend the City of Charlottetown Procedural Bylaw Bylaw # 2018-19-F

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:

PART I - INTERPRETATION AND APPLICATION

1. Title

1.1. This bylaw shall be known and cited as the "Procedural Amendment Bylaw."

2. Purpose

2.1. The purpose of this bylaw is to amend the City of Charlottetown's Procedural Bylaw (#2018-19) in which the Mayor may establish, from among the members of the Council, such standing and ad hoc committees as they consider appropriate.

3. Authority

3.1. Pursuant to Part 5, Section 134 (1) – Revision of Bylaws of the Municipal Government Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. M-12.

4. Definitions

4.1. In this bylaw, any word and term that is defined in the Municipal Government Act, Procedural Bylaw Regulations and the City of Charlottetown Procedural Bylaw has the same meaning as in the Act, Regulations or Bylaw.

5. Section 42 – Committees of Council - of the City of Charlottetown Procedural Bylaw is hereby amended by the following:

- 5.1. Repeal sections 42.1, 42.2, 42.3 and 42.4 which refer to the role of the Council Advisory Committee and replace with the following:
 - 42.1 The Mayor may establish standing and/or ad hoc committees that will consider, discuss and debate matters of Council interest before such matters are forwarded to Council for decision.
 - 42.2. The Mayor may also designate the committees' mandate, term, composition, objectives, tasks, duties and responsibilities, and appoint its members to deal with any matter. The Mayor may also establish the eligibility criteria for membership and determine the events or circumstances that would result in termination of a committee member.
 - 42.3. The Mayor will, by order, dissolve a committee of Council upon completion of their specific mandate.
